Jones and his unit was tasked with conducting mainly unconventional warfare in northern Iraq during the major combat phase of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. Fighting in conjunction with and training Kurdish forces from the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan, their mission was to hold 13 of Saddam Hussein's 20 divisions along the Green Line, as well as to destroy the al-Qaeda affiliated Ansar al-Islam terrorist camp in the area. In this interview, Jones also discusses in great detail how his SF compatriots built and maintained rapport with the Kurdish Peshmerga, who were remarkably tenacious fighters, made an enormous contribution and who had a standing order not to allow any Americans to get killed. In addition, he talks about the fall of Kirkuk, the conduct of insurgency and counterinsurgency operations in general, and the role he sees (and recommends) Special Operations Forces playing in future conflicts. As I look at the battlefield today, Jones said, based on all the experiences that I've had, SOF should be...
