He was born at Harrowden, in the Parish of Elstow, England. He wrote *The Pilgrims Progress* (1678- 1684), arguably the most famous published Christian allegory. In the Church of England he is remembered with a Lesser Festival on 30 August. Bunyan had very little schooling (about 2-4 years). He followed his father in the Tarish Tinkers trade, and he served in the parliamentary army at Newport Pagnell (1644-1647). In 1655, Bunyan became a deacon and began preaching, with marked success from the start. He also became a popular preacher as well as a prolific author, though most of his works consist of expanded sermons. He was no scholar, except of the English Bible, but he knew scripture thoroughly. In his autobiographical book, *Grace Abounding* (1666), Bunyan describes himself as having led an abandoned life in his youth, and as having been morally reprehensible as a result.
